Research shows that 88% of children who engage in highly aggressive bullying behaviour become significantly less aggressive after they receive Roots of Empathy. When they do not receive ROE, the majority of these children go on to bully significantly more than they were already.

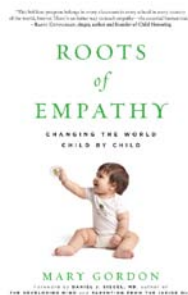

Shine a Light

ROE advocate Thelma Messer



Thelma Messer of New Brunswick, Canada, first heard of ROE nearly a decade ago. As a public health nurse in the Healthy Learners in School program, a government initiative that sees nurses assigned to school districts, Messer had worked with a local advisory committee to identify social and emotional health as a key health promotion priority for the children in her district.

She'd heard of ROE before, which prompted her to request a presentation about it for her community in 2001. "It was extremely well received," she says. "We saw right away that Roots of Empathy was a perfect fit and had the evidence behind it. Everyone said 'Oh my goodness; we need to have this in our schools.'"

Today ROE is reaching nearly 500 children in Messer's school

district. Her dream is to see every child across the province experience it, ideally twice (once in elementary and once in middle school). "If you have something that's good, that works, you want to share it," she says.

Messer is one of six Healthy Learner nurses acting as Key Point People (local program coordinators) for ROE programs in New Brunswick. Over the years, she has also been an Instructor and Mentor and made numerous community and government presentations about ROE, and now she is involved as a Trainer. "ROE is a big investment in those children," she says. "It's very well done, very intentional. The children are learning a lot and I feel it's a very valuable use of my time. If I can impact more children by facilitating other people who deliver it, that's pretty exciting."

Mary's Message



In February I was deeply saddened to learn of the suicide of 15-year-old Ashkan Sultani, a death that has been linked to the daily bullying this boy experienced at two successive high schools in British Columbia. My heart goes out to his family.

This tragedy was a failure of society. We need to address the prevalence of bullying, and draw the curtain on the shame and humiliation children and youth feel about being bullied, so that children like Ashkan no longer kill themselves in despair when they see no way out from the tormenting. The only way to truly prevent bullying is to work with children so they stop it themselves. We can help them stand up to peers who bully others, and we can also provide them with better emotional support so they do not become bullies in the first place.

Empathy is a natural brake to bullying. It is the base of all kindness and caring, while a lack of empathy is the base for all forms of cruelty. We need to foster empathy and build on children's social and emotional understanding, from preschool right through to high school. Otherwise we are failing the many Ashkans of the world - children who deserve better.
